Centrally located in the Lower Mainland, the City of Langley provides easy access to regional and USA markets for a variety of industrial residents, from manufacturing to flex-use tenants. Proximity to diverse amenities and a skilled labour force have contributed to the long-term success of this sector, which comprises more than 2.86 million square feet of industrial floor space and accounts for approximately 20% of employment in the City.

OPPORTUNITIES

Located in the heart of one of Metro Vancouver's Regional City Centres, the City of Langley is the ideal location for medium to light industrial tenants, such as manufacturing, scientific R&D, and higher-order industrial uses. In particular, there is greater opportunity for more multi-tenant, flex-use office-commercial-industrial developments.

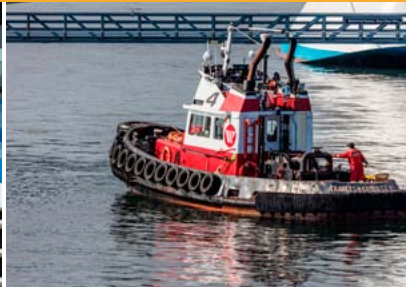
Supporting industrial growth and development, the municipal government allows a broader range of uses in industrial zones, while continuing to protect railway access for manufacturing industries.

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CENTRAL LOCATION

Centrally located in the Lower Mainland, the City of Langley (population: 26,000) is part of the Metro Vancouver Regional District (population: 2.3 million). Only 35 kilometers east of the City of Vancouver, the City of Langley is located at the crossroads of several major highways, transected by Highway #10 and the Fraser Highway, with easy access to TransCanada Highway #1 and Highway #15 (176th street). It is close to three major USA border crossings: Peace Arch, Pacific Crossing (176th street) and Aldergrove (264th street).

The City of Langley is also well served with easy railway access to the CN and Southern Railway of BC lines. The City is also close to the Abbotsford International Airport, the Vancouver International Airport, and the Port of Vancouver and its Fraser River ports.

SUPPLIERS

Designated as one of Metro Vancouver's Regional City Centres, the City of Langley provides an excellent base of shops and supplies, providing about 7.5 million square feet of commercial-office-industrial suppliers plus much more just beyond City boundaries.

WORKFORCE

As the City of Langley is only 10 square kilometers, its resident workforce is only 13,505 people (of a total population of 26,000), yet its estimated employment market is 19,000 jobs. However, as one of Metro Vancouver's Regional City Centres, it attracts a talented, skilled and educated labour force of 326,000 people within a 30-minute commute.

The City of Langley is also home to a significant resource of skilled workers. Kwantlen

Polytechnic University (enrollment: about 3,000), Trinity Western University (enrollment: about 3,000) and several other career training schools have generated a skilled worker pool, where 57.6% of the population (aged 24+) have achieved a postsecondary degree, diploma or certificate.

ECONOMICAL LAND

The City of Langley enjoys housing costs that are about 50% lower than the City of Vancouver. Industrial Land is also significantly lower, at about \$800,000 per acre compared to \$4.2 million in Vancouver or \$1.4 million in Richmond. Industrial leasing costs range from \$6 to \$9 per square foot. And commercial leasing rates range from \$10 to \$35 per square foot.
