Nature and Scope of Work

The fire fighter is responsible for firefighting entailing the combating, extinguishing and preventing fires and the saving of life and property. A fire fighter is responsible for rapidly and efficiently performing various duties under emergency conditions frequently involving considerable hazard.

The fire fighter's work includes routine duties in the maintenance of firefighting equipment the Fire Department property.

Carrying out the specific orders and directions as received from a superior officer in the normal course of maintenance duties and in fire fighting, considerable independence of judgment and action is allowed in circumstances of extreme urgency where referral to a superior for instruction is not possible.

Work is constantly reviewed by a superior to maintain and improve the efficiency of the Fire Department as a whole.

Illustrative Examples of Work

1. As a member of the Department, responds to fire alarms, lays and connects hose, holds nozzle and directs water streams, raises and climbs ladders, uses chemical extinguishers, bars, hooks, lines and other equipment.
2. Ventilates fires to release heat and smoke, places salvage covers to prevent water damage and prevents fire from rekindling.
3. As assigned, drives and operates motor driven fire fighting equipment.
4. As assigned, receives and records telephone fire alarms and other emergency calls and assists in dispatching property apparatus and equipment.
5. Performs various maintenance tasks on apparatus and equipment.
6. When assigned to fire prevention work under direction of a superior, performs inspections and clerical duties as required.
7. Performs related work as required.

Required Knowledge, Abilities and Skills

1. Thorough knowledge of the operation of all apparatus and equipment and methods used in combating, extinguishing and preventing fires and in rescue work.
2. Thorough knowledge of first aid and inhalator practices.

3. Considerable knowledge of rules and regulations of the Fire Department.
4. Considerable knowledge of the maintenance of equipment.
5. Considerable knowledge of building construction and related codes, electrical power codes, hydraulics and the location of hazardous occupancies in the City.
6. Considerable mechanical aptitude.
7. Considerable knowledge of water systems and water mains.
8. Agility and strength to do prolonged and arduous work under adverse conditions.
9. Ability to react quickly and remain calm under duress and strain.
10. Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions.
11. Skill in the operation of all fire fighting and rescue equipment including motor vehicles.
12. Interest and willingness to assist in community efforts throughout the City.

Desirable Training and Experience

1. Graduation from a standard senior high school or technical school; or
2. Equivalent combination of training and experience sufficient to indicate ability to do the work.

Required Licences, Certificates and Registrations

1. Valid Class 3 Driver's Licence for the Province of British Columbia with air brake endorsement.
